

Thiokol Greenway Progress Report and Opportunity to Contribute

One of the objectives of the HDAA is to preserve the good image of the organization and foster the spirit that we found to be valuable during its 47-year history (1949 – 1996) of the Huntsville Division. HDAA board members have been working for several years to establish a Thiokol Greenway near the plant site and then develop a marker for that portion of the greenway. This includes a sign and two benches mounted on a concrete pad. The Thiokol Greenway is part of an 8-mile section of city greenway construction being completed at Hays Farm in southwest Huntsville near the arsenal boundary. In turn, this is part of a 44-mile phase of citywide trail/greenway construction. So, this is a part of a bigger effort to promote health and recreation in the Huntsville area and is very much in keeping with our objectives in the HDAA bylaws.

This effort is proceeding well, as you can tell from the attached photos. The greenway itself is paved and connects all the way to Haysland Square Shopping Center, but the connector to Rothmore Drive is still in fine gravel. The concrete pad and sign are completed and in place. The two benches remain to be purchased and installed.

There has been a lot of interest in this project, with questions about how people could contribute to it. The last phase of the project is the acquisition of two benches. This purchase must be done through the city so they will be ordering, installing, and maintaining the benches. The total amount required for the two benches is \$3,670, installed. Any amount of money donated above this goal may be used for landscaping around the Thiokol Greenway pad. (A generous anonymous contribution has been received to initiate this effort.)
